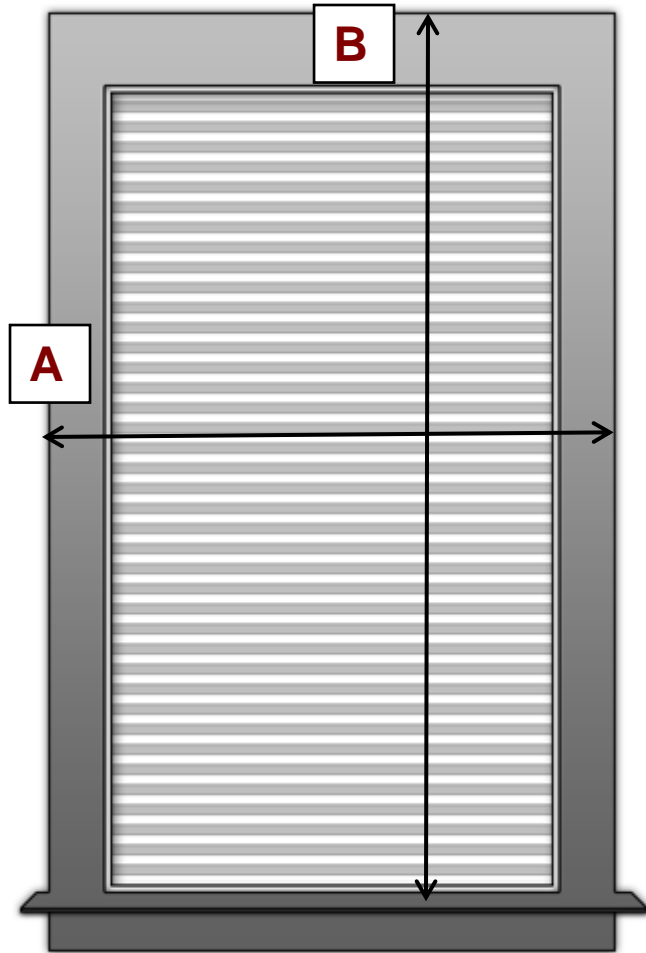


# Measuring for the Basic Shade



- A. Measure the Width of the window from the edge of the trim. You may decide you would like the shade slightly smaller to fit under existing hardware for other window treatments. If this is the case, be sure that a flat surface at least  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch is available for the application of the hook and loop tape onto the window trim.
- B. Measure the height of the window, from the top of the trim (or lower, if you choose to have it under an existing window treatment), and measure down to the top of the window sill. If your window does not have a sill, measure to the bottom of the lower trim. There will be a “lip” on the bottom of your shade. This is to ensure that the shade fits snug to the bottom of the window trim. Your shade will come with a 1 inch wide hook and loop at the top of the shade, and  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch hook and loop tape on the other three sides.
- C. For an outside mount, add 3 inches to the height and width measurements.

# Installing the Basic Shade



Locate where you would like the shade to fit on your window, and with a level, draw a pencil line to ensure you are installing your shade straight.

# Installing the Basic Shade



Remove the adhesive side of the hook and loop tape from the top of shade, and place on or above window trim (depending on where you choose to install your basic shade.)



Using a staple gun, staple hook and loop into place. Place Curtain on window, and adjust for proper placement.



# Installing the Basic Shade



Line up hook and loop tape on side of the shade, and attach to window, securing with staples.

# Installing the Basic Shade



Secure hook and loop tape on bottom side of window, if desired.

# Installing the Basic Shade



To open shade, fold shade under, and press to secure to hook and loop tape on sides of window.



This can be done from either the top or the bottom of the shade.
